Do we grasp the enormity of serving as God’s new priests? Then gratefully and reverently offer up the new priestly sacrifices.


Do not neglect to do good and to share what you have, for such sacrifices are pleasing to God. (Hebrews 13:16)

Sharing Freedom

WBS can be very effective in prison outreach.

Three prisoners who were World Bible School students were baptized into Christ recently at the Beltline church of Christ in Decatur, Alabama. After some effort, Ashley, Lisa and Cassandra were given permission to leave jail for baptism. Danny Truitt writes:

Two deputies brought them to the building in handcuffs and shackles. The handcuffs and shackles were removed to allow them to put on baptismal garments and then the handcuffs were placed on them again. The ankle shackles were left off to allow them to better negotiate the steps in the baptistery. All three ladies—all very young—were students of my wife, Deborah. Needless to say, she is pumped beyond measure!

We have studied with 88 inmates to date. Six inmates have been baptized and four others have requested baptism just last week. The jail population is about 400, so by the grace of God, we have studied with almost one-fourth of all inmates currently in the county jail.

The God Bless East Africa campaign (GBEA) is moving forward to recruit tens of thousands of new students for World Bible School. I just returned from spending five weeks in Kenya with my wife and son, Elaine and Evan. We visited eight locations for Bible seminars or public preaching and WBS enrollment. In Kericho, we spoke at two prisons and attended the graduation of some 60 inmates who finished their WBS studies. The Gospel Chariot from South

Sharing Pain & Power

One of my students writes extensively on Facebook. Here is a summary of her testimony.

I'm "Saved"! I've accepted that Jesus Christ died on the cross, taking on my sins and redeeming me to God. I've been baptized and am now a new creation in Christ with the gift of eternal life.

My husband had atheistic beliefs. After we moved to Germany, God answered my prayers to be able to conceive. However, Christ's words rang in my head: "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul?" My one prayer request was still unanswered, "Lord, when will my husband come to you?"

When 2014 arrived I decided it was time to buckle down and get closer to God which meant getting into the Word of God. I signed up for online Bible courses through World Bible School. This was something I could do while caring for my two year old. Also, I began praying for a Facebook friend

with cancer. Little did I know God was passing me the support structure to face a cancer mountain that would come my way.

My husband was diagnosed with cancer. His pain was overwhelming. I felt my world crumbling...pregnant, stressed out and unable to stop crying. But I realized, worrying wrecks nothing but havoc and leaves you sleepless, tired and out of energy. So I asked believing friends and family to pray. I wanted my husband to be saved before he met our Maker. Two days before surgery, he told me he was ready for Jesus to be his Lord. He entered surgery with no stress, no worry, just peace, and I knew that Christ was already working in him. After an eight hour operation, the doctors said he was clear of cancer.

The WBS courses encouraged me so much—they carried me through. Instead of sitting and worrying, I was eating up the word of God and getting stronger. The lessons about praying without fear or doubt moved me and I knew that my husband had already won the battle right then and there. I was singing worship songs and rejoicing already.

When Bob retired from his nuclear engineering career in 2000, he got more involved, and in 2007 they launched WEI Internet teaching. WEI and WBS share common roots and strong bonds. With the help of their grandson Jonathan, the Towells pioneered effective Internet teaching, which also benefited WBS through

Jonathan's leadership in WBS Internet since 2011. Dick Ady, President Emeritus of WEI, says of the Towells, "They are tremendous partners in world evangelism and some of my favorite people in all the world. It is a joy to work with them. WEI owes them a lot." WEI has taught over 205,000 students via Internet. When Jonathan learned of WBS' award for his grandparents, he wrote the following reasons:

For connecting Christians. For serving seekers. For sacrificing retirement. For putting others first. For logging thousands of miles on the road and being happy to do it. For giving, giving more and giving again. For persevering. For doggedly pursuing a vision. For sifting through a thousand "no's", eagerly anticipating the next "yes." For being stubborn, seeing the world as it should be, not accepting what it is. For loving each other all the while. For setting an example. For pointing us to the cross. You never asked us to look at you, but we do it anyway. We know disciples when we see them. You are the aroma of Christ. And you make us proud.

Still Sharing

God keeps sharing His blessings through the Deals.

Lloyd and Barbara Deal have shared the Gospel with more souls than can be counted (on earth)... and they are still sharing. They have had four distinct careers.



Lloyd and Barbara Deal

- 1) After Lloyd's 1956 graduation from ACC, they pursued mission work in Washington state, and later in Kansas.
- 2) From 1964, they worked with Jerry Loutzenhiser to plant congregations in Iowa. Sponsored by the College church in Searcy, AR, their campaigners knocked on 66% of doors in the entire state, and mass mailings increased outreach to 90% of all homes.
- 3) 1986 through 2007 saw over 2,000 baptized, and over a dozen churches establish in their campaigns to East Africa. Lloyd made 24 trips and Barbara 15. Their teams enrolled many thousands in World Bible School.
- 4) In 1988 the Deals moved to Memorial Road church of Christ in Edmond, OK, and were later asked to coordinate the WBS program. Even now, though travel is limited, they continue to teach thousands with the help of their WBS team.

In addition, their teaching is multiplied many times over because those they teach are sharing with others. For example, Lloyd wrote to me about Beatrice Otieno Ohango in Kenya. Her WBS teacher had been Sharon Chamber. Now the Deals supply Beatrice with materials for her ladies' classes. The materials include Lloyd's famous *God Makes a Man* series, and his new series *Beautiful Qualities of Christ*.

At the recent Oklahoma City WBS Dinner, it was our honor to recognize the outstanding—and continuing—life-work of Lloyd and Barbara Deal.

Danny knew Paul was a Christian but responded to the lessons as he would to any student. Here is Paul's comment after completing the Master Series.

I started today with three new students and I just want to say that my approach is different now that I have gone through the course myself. I now have a feel for how the topics are laid out and have a feel for the sequential unfolding of the complete story. Before, I felt compelled to shape and correct views prematurely because I did not sense the repetitive development of the central truths of the Gospel. I hope to be a much more effective messenger in the future. You are correct in suggesting that each new teacher be asked (required) to work through the course as a condition to being a teacher.

Improving Referral Return Rates

Boosting demand for studies.

When you send WBS lessons to referral students, would you like to see better returns? Here are two interesting approaches.

Try "self referrals".

Suzanne Gore of North Carolina told me: "I don't take referral student names." Why? Some whose names are given to WBS don't know they've been referred, and sometimes have no interest. Suzanne prefers "self referral." She pastes her own note over the booklet's referral section, telling her students that she will teach any of their friends who write her requesting the WBS course. This method keeps Suzanne busy. In her words, "I mail something every day. I can't keep up with the demand."

Or, try "hand delivery".

Kathleen Withers, a Florida WBS teacher since 1974, prepares Intro lessons for referral students, but mails them back to the referring student to be hand-delivered. That way the referral student knows how WBS got their name and receives personal encouragement to use the lesson.

Sharing in Brazzaville, Congo

Two capitals face each other across the Congo River. Twelve teachers and students had come from the Hilton Terry Bible School of the Congo in Kinshasa to participate in the Brazzaville campaign. They were to join two brothers from the USA, Larry Terry from Dallas and Aaron Palmer from Nashville, and four from Europe. Four days of seminars were planned to bring together students of the French World Bible School, contacts from radio and newspaper ads, and from distribution in the streets of 10,000 flyers. After several efforts, however, the 12 men from Kinshasa were not allowed to cross the river to Brazzaville. This initiated a major change for the campaign's conduct.

The planned daily seminars in Brazzaville went ahead with a reduced teaching force: Clovis Tshimanga of Brazzaville and a few local brethren, Chrysostom Samba of Pointe-Noire, Congo, and the six foreigners. Twenty-nine local contacts attended. The climax was Sunday morning when nine members of the small Brazzaville church and several seminar contacts came together for the worship assembly.

The small local church is reinforced, the number of teachable contacts has greatly increased, and many more Congolese people are enrolled in the French World Bible School. In addition, Doyle Kee began placing "Ressources bibliques" CDs in Brazzaville postal boxes. The first 60 copies were placed in the mail boxes of the authorities of the city.

The campaign was blessed. There is a need, however, for a church to partner with the small Brazzaville church to expand the Kingdom in this central African country. The two trained men are in place in Brazzaville and Pointe-Noire and need a partnering church that will take on the entire country as its mission field. The actual cost of such support would be relatively low, and could be set up to end in five years. Perhaps your local church could accept this challenge. 
